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PSA Planning Chart

PURPOSE

As your class prepares to make a PSA, the attached worksheet is a useful tool to help your students brainstorm their PSA project.

HOW TO USE THE PLANNING CHART

1. Ask your class to define “public service announcement” or “PSA.” Most of them will know some of the recent anti-smoking video campaigns. Explain that you are going to be making a PSA as a class.
2. Next, students should come up with their ideas for a PSA. Using the brainstorming sheet, have students take several minutes to come up with some ideas for PSAs (some examples: why walking is great for your health, why it’s important to make our city safer for walkers, ways you can make walking a part of your commute). This is a good time for students to work in pairs or in small groups to focus their ideas.
3. Students can share their ideas with the class. Write down the ideas and then have the class narrow down the list of ideas until you have selected the specific topic for their PSA.
4. For this particular contest, this PSA can be in any of a variety of formats. Will you make a poster, PowerPoint, song, dance, film, play, website, or something else? You might already have planned the scope or medium, but you can get the students involved in the decision-making process along the way.
5. All the students should be involved in the process even though we are accepting only ONE PSA PER CLASS. You can divide them up however you feel is most appropriate, (a team for research, a team for content creation, a team for design, etc.)

CREATE AND UPLOAD YOUR PSA FOR STEP THREE

Once you have made your PSA, you should upload a photo, sound file, video, PowerPoint, word document or PDF to our website under Step 3: Sharing Your Message (<http://streetseducation.org/walkingschools>.) You were registered for the contest when you uploaded your walking data, but please mark it carefully with your class, school and contact information.

EXTENSION: INDEPENDENT RESEARCH

After submitting you PSA, you can encourage students to conduct independent research for a paper or project on one of the following subjects: suburbanization and walkability, the health effects of the built environment, childhood obesity and its relationship to walking, urban air quality and transportation, or another related topic.
